How to help your child at home

Check that your child has a quiet place to complete their homework.

Take an active interest in what they are learning in school and, if possible, share your knowledge about the topic with your child.

Practise reading the clock and working out time differences. Show them the different British coins and help them work out paying amounts up to £1.00 and £2.00. Are they able to work out how much change they should get if they paid for an item that costs 80p with a £1.00 coin?

If you have a bit of spare change, show your child the different British coins and ask them to add them up.

Play games: board games, dice games, word games.

Enjoy the outdoors together.

English

We start the term by looking at different sources to find out about world explorers like Captain Cook and Ibn Battuta. We will find out if there are still any explorers living today. We will then write our fact files about explorers!

We will read *The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch*. We will role play the story and then make our own story maps so that we can retell it.

We will also be reading some of the other books in the series so that we can write our own adventure for Mr and Mrs Grinling!

Maths

We start the term thinking about fractions. We will learn about half, quarters and thirds.

We will then move on to addition and subtraction of two 2-digit numbers. We will illustrate, represent and explain addition and subtraction involving regrouping, including 'Make Ten', 'Round and adjust' and near doubles strategies.

We will then move on to money. We will recognise

coins and notes using £ and p accurately.

We will add and subtract amounts and try to calculate change.



Topic



Our topic this term is *Land Ahoy*! During the term we will navigate, investigate and explore the world - just like Captain Cook. We will look at the life of a pirate, and draw some of our own treasure maps. We will also be thinking about how rescues happen at sea. We will find out about brave volunteers and Grace Darling, rowing her boat across stormy seas. We will also look at the countries that make up the UK and learn their capital cities. Hopefully we will sing a sea shanty or two along the way! It is going to be lots of fun!

RHE

In Relationships and Health Education we will be thinking about 'What helps us to stay safe?'

<u>PE</u>

This term we are practising our tennis skills. We will start with hand-eye coordination and changing direction quickly before moving on to racquet skills.

RE

This term's topic is called Salvation and the key question is: Why does Easter matter to Christians?

Through this topic we will be learning about the importance of the Easter story and that Jesus was willing to forgive all people, even for putting him on the cross. We will be thinking, talking and asking questions about what the Easter story teaches us about forgiveness.

Music

Children will continue to consolidate their knowledge of crotchets and quavers. They will create their own rhythmic compositions using body percussion to make a variety of sounds.

Drama and Dance

In drama this term we are going to explore the topic through a book called *The Pirate Piper*. We will explore themes, story and character using improvisation and the drama strategies.

Language of the Term

This term we are learning some Italian, starting with finding out a few Italian words used in English, for instance pasta, pizza, graffiti or volcano.
