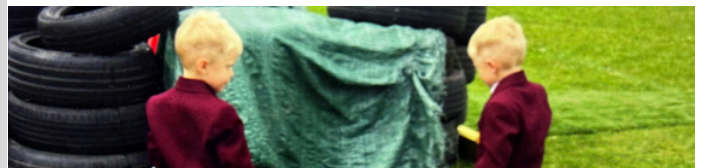
Upcoming Events

Morning routines

Firstly, thank you to everybody for adjusting to our 'hard starts' at 8.45am, rather than the window of drop off we were offering this time last year. This has made a big difference in the classroom, and it means that we are now able to start every day with a whole-school worship, gaining valuable learning time before and after.

You may have noticed that it is less common now for your child's class teacher to be at the door in the morning. The first few minutes of the school day are crucially important for your children and a calm, predictable entrance to the classroom will reassure all children that they are in a safe space; not all anxiety is obvious. The people best placed to create this environment are the class teachers. I hope you understand. There will always be a member of staff on the door, and a combination of Mrs Baker (our SENCo), myself and Mrs Egan will always be available as well should you need to discuss anything or pass on any messages.

For safeguarding reasons, it is important that parents do not enter the cloakroom unless explicitly asked to and with a member of staff present.
