## Book Recommendation

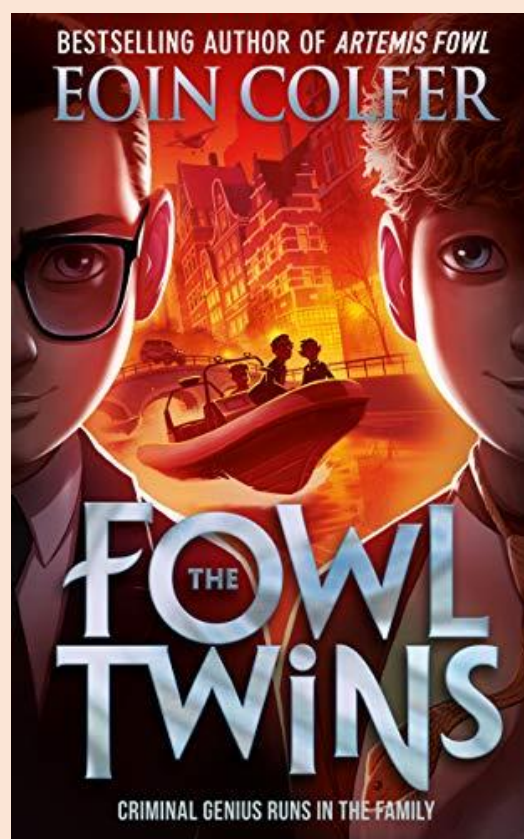
### This month's recommendation from Mrs Egan

**The Fowl Twins** written by Eoin Colfer

Recommended reading age: 9+

Myles and Beckett Fowl are not your ordinary set of twins: their father and older brother used to be master criminals; their brother also happens to be the world's smartest human being; when they were young, their bodies were taken over by two ancient fairies who may have left morsels of their powers inside them. But that's not what the book is about! (If you are interested in those stories, you have to read the Artemis Fowl series by Eoin Colfer.)

The Fowl Twins is a fast-paced action book, in which Myles and Beckett enjoy adventure and mayhem to help a troll escape nefarious forces, supported by a pixie police officer who is unable to contact the Lower Elements Police Force for help. They get kidnapped, shot at, interrogated, threatened with torture – and through all this they realise that despite their differences, they are having an unbreakable bond between them.





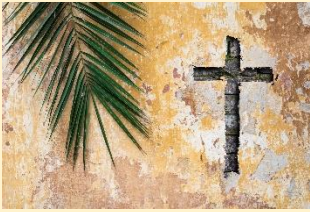
## Class R

Year 6 visited St Luke's Church, where they made chocolate egg nests, learnt about the Easter story and discussed our RE topic, salvation.





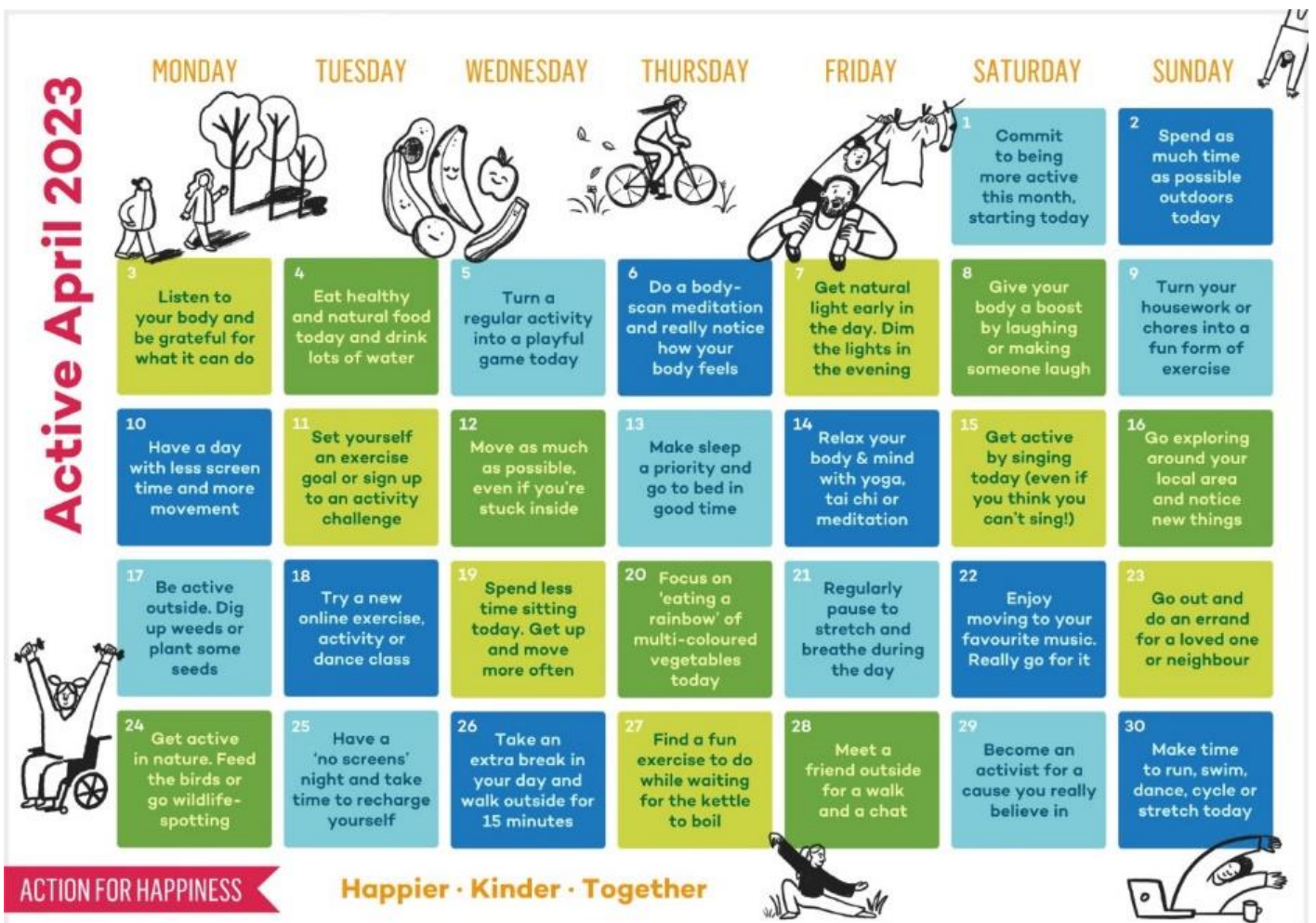
# News from our Wellbeing and Learning Mentor
