Activity: Adding more information

This week, we have been looking at how we can use conjunctions to link two or more sentences together. For example:

Take your coat because it might rain.

Plus, we have also written sentences using a conjunction or adverb (e.g. *however*) at the beginning of the sentence for emphasis. For example:

As normal dad washed up.

Using connectives to add information can help you to tell the reader when, where, how and why things happen. They also can tell the reader if they will happen.
