\* Dear Parents – when the children are asked to write something – don't worry too much about spelling. They should be spelling the high frequency words correctly (the, they, then what, said, etc.). When spelling other unfamiliar words, they should use their phonic knowledge. We always say – 'have a go'. Use your sounds – it doesn't matter if it's wrong! The writing tasks are there for the children to get used to writing and become more confident. They can also practise their punctuation skills. If you notice that your child is spelling 'they' wrong (I'm only mention this as an example) – use it as one of your spellings words to work on this week.
